We were surprised to see more Ducks and Waders than expected. There were Tufted, Shovelar, Golden Plover, Little Grebe, Shelduck and two we hadn't seen before. They were a Greenshank and a Garganey which looks similar to a Teal but has a white stripe on its head. As we enjoyed our warm drinks the talk turned to much larger birds (Turkeys) with only two days to go until Christmas!

What a lovely January morning it was as we started out to explore Abberton Reservoir Nature Reserve. We had Liz, a warden on the site, to join us. She told us about the changes being made to the site plus pathways for wheelchair users and a new visitor's centre. Sometimes we see the same birds every month but with Liz there she was able to point out birds we could have missed. We saw Meadow Pipit, Reed Bunting Blue and Great Tits and a Kestrel that was just sitting on top of a branch. It was wonderful to stand in the morning sun with colourful Goldfinches darting about on the seed heads and the Skylark above us in full song. It had been a great morning.

There are also some extra walks around Docklands in this programme. Walks from the West come from Windsor and follow the Thames downriver to Stratford and there is a walk along the River Wandle from the South. The walk from the North is along the River Lea from Luton.

Walks have started with one walk per month. The Thames Estuary walk starts on June 9th and finishes on 17th June.
