### **Important Notice: Committee Nominations 2013**

We will have to elect a new Chairman and several committee members at the AGM on the 8<sup>th</sup> March 2013. Details of the posts requiring nominations are given below:

### Chairman

Our constitution stipulates that the Chairman can only hold office for 3 consecutive years. A retiring Chairman is not eligible for re-election during the next 12 months. Peter Thorpe is retiring as Chairman and is not seeking nomination for any position on the committee in 2013.

Joyce Woodham, currently Vice-Chairman and Programme Secretary, is eligible and willing to be nominated for election. This position is also open to other nominations.

Nomination forms will be attached to the February News Sheet. One form needs to be completed by each person wishing to stand for a position on the Heybridge U3A Committee. The Nomination Form needs to be signed by the Nominee, Proposer and Seconder and given to or posted to the Secretary at "Drifters", Church Road, West Hanningfield, Essex, CM2 8UJ, to arrive by Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2013. If there is more than one person nominated for any one position, a vote will take place at the AGM on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> March 2013.

The names of Nominees and positions will be published in the March issue of the News Sheet, which will be available prior to the AGM.

Armed with binoculars we set off along the muddy path towards Maldon. There were quite a lot of waders on the water's edge for us to watch (sorry, but I have lost the full list of birds seen). After slipping and sliding on the muddy path and feeling the cold we decided to make our way back to the warmth of the café for a chat and hot drink. We have had some great times in 2012 so let's make 2013 even better.

We chose Hanningfield Reserve for January visit as with the water and snow around we wanted somewhere with good paths to get to the hides without getting too muddy. # **Wine Appreciation Group**

At our January meeting we compared notes on the aroma of a masked red wine and discussed the differences between new young wines and older mature wines. We also put together a diary of suggestions for meetings and visits in 2013. There will be no meeting in February. The next meeting is arranged for Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> March 2013 at 95 Barbrook Lane, Tiptree, starting at 14.00. There will be a horizontal tasting of Sauvignon Blanc.

Grapes for wine production are grown in two major zones located both north and south of the equator. The first zone is located between the 30<sup>th</sup> & 50<sup>th</sup> lines of latitude north of the equator, which encompasses France, Italy, Germany, Spain, Portugal and the United States. The second zone, located between the 30<sup>th</sup> & 40<sup>th</sup> lines of latitude south of the equator includes South America, South Africa, Argentina, Australia and New Zealand. We shall be comparing two

wines from different zones. As Sauvignon Blanc is now the most popular white wine drunk in the UK, with the NZ wines recognised as the benchmark for taste, we will put them to the test by comparing one from the Marlborough region and one from Europe. In April we are planning a visit to a local Wine Merchant to learn more about the business of choosing wines for sale to the British public and later in the summer we plan to visit local vineyards followed by a picnic (weather permitting).
