The Nomination Form needs to be signed by the Nominee, Proposer and Seconder and given to or posted to the Secretary at 12 Rowan Drive, Heybridge, Maldon CM9 4BW to arrive by Friday 24th February 2016. If there is more than one person nominated for any one position, a vote will take place at the AGM on the 10th March 2017. The names of Nominees and positions will be published in the March issue of the News Sheet, which will be available prior to the AGM.

The minutes of the AGM held in March 2016 will be sent out by email together with the Agenda for the forthcoming AGM and printed copies will be available on 10th March 2017

• 2017/18 Subscription Renewal

As you are aware, our membership year runs from 1st April to 31st March. This means that you will need to re-enrol by the end of March if you wish to continue your membership.

A re-enrolment form is attached with this News Sheet and copies will also be available at the monthly meeting. Instructions on how to pay are contained on the form. Payments will be accepted from the February monthly meeting onwards.

Subject to ratification at the AGM, the standard fee for 2017/18 will be £18. This is £2 lower than previous years to compensate for the charge which has recently been introduced for refreshments at the monthly meetings. The dual membership fee (which applies to fully paid up members of other U3As)* will be reduced from £15 to £13.

In the unlikely event that the AGM does not approve this reduction, the fee will remain at £20 (£15 for dual members) and a further £2 will be payable

* Members of the four Maldon U3As (Blackwater, Heybridge, Limebrook and Maldon) who wish only to access each other's interest groups can do so without paying a membership charge provided spaces are available.

Gift Aid

If you are a tax payer, the U3A can claim Gift Aid on your subscription provided you

"Have paid, or will pay, an amount of income and/or capital gains tax for each year that is at least equal to the amount of tax that all the Charities to which they donate will reclaim on gifts made during that year. If the tax paid is less than the amount of Gift Aid claimed on all donations, it is the individual's responsibility to pay any difference."

HMRC 2016

The Gift Aid Declaration on the enrolment form was updated in 2016 to reflect the new HMRC wording and we would like to thank everyone who signed this last year. If you pay sufficient tax but have not yet signed the revised declaration (or cannot remember doing so), please consider signing this year. The amount we can reclaim on gift aided subscriptions is 25%, i.e. £4.50 on a subscription of £18, which may help us to reduce subscriptions in future years.



Notice Of The Annual General Meeting Of The Third Age Trust 2017

Notice is hereby given that the 34th Annual General Meeting of the Third Age Trust will be held at The East Midlands Conference Centre, Nottingham on Thursday 31st August 2017, commencing at 11.15 am (time to be confirmed at a later date). Details of the agenda will be circulated to all U3As by the end of May.

Submission of Proposed Resolutions for the 2017 Annual General Meeting U3As are requested to submit proposed resolutions with supporting statements to the Company Secretary at the above address by 28th April 2017. They can only be accepted if they are proposed by one U3A and seconded by another. The National Executive Committee is required to determine the business of the Annual General Meeting. This implies that where there are similarities or duplications of proposed resolutions, an amalgamated resolution may be arranged after due consultation with the appropriate U3As. A list of the proposed resolutions received for the AGM will be circulated to all U3As by the end of May 2017. Any amendments to proposed resolutions will be required by the end of June 2017. As with resolutions, amendments must be proposed and seconded by U3As. The list of amendments to the proposed resolutions will be sent to all U3As as soon as possible after the end of June. The National Executive Committee has the responsibility to examine the amendments, reject any that introduce new matter to or are a direct negation of the original resolution and to arrange amalgamations where appropriate, in consultation with the originating U3As. The proposer and seconder of a proposed resolution or an amendment must be prepared to be present at the Annual General Meeting and to speak in support, otherwise it will be withdrawn.
Election of Officers and Members of the National Executive Committee The nomination forms will be sent to you with the agenda by the end of May 2017. Nominations for Officers and Members of the National Executive Committee will be required by the end of June 2017. All candidates must be either nominated or seconded by their own U3A.
Officers Pam Jones will have served as Chairman for two years and is eligible for re-election. John Ellison will have served as Treasurer for five years and is eligible for re-election. Marion Clements will have served as Vice Chairman for three years and is not eligible for re-election. Michaela Moody will have served as Vice Chairman for two years and is eligible for re-election.

Regional Trustees 5 regional trustees will be retiring this year: - Diana Holdsworth (South West), lan McCannah (London), Anthony Randall (West Midlands), Hilary Robinson (South East), and Neil Stevens (Yorkshire & the Humber). Regional trustees can be nominated and seconded by any U3A in that region. These elections will be by postal voting only.

All U3As may participate in nominating candidates and voting whether it be by proxy before the

AGM or at the AGM itself through their representative(s).
