We then went on to look at the 'articulated prepositions', where a preposition joins to the definite article, as in the French *du, de la, de l' des.* In Italian there are 5 different prepositions that join to the various ways of saying 'the'. It seems horribly complicated at first, but there is a logic to it, so it soon becomes easier to remember how to form them, and it is worth the trouble to learn them as they are used in everyday situations. After that we wound down with the usual coffee, biscuit and a chat.

Photography Group

Our assignment for last month was to take a photo using a single source of light. The idea was to make the photographer aware of the effect of light on the subject of the photograph. It was interesting to see how we interpreted a "single source of light". In a classic U3A way, it started an impromptu debate on whether sun light through mist was from a single source or from billions of minute water droplets. The difference between the two interpretations was whether the finished photo had strong shadows and a well defined subject or a soft, low contrast dream like look. Photography has been described as painting with light and understanding how to use the available light is the key to getting a pleasing shot.

Pat's photo of a smack lit from the side by a low sun is an excellent example of using light to emphasise both the sails and the surface of the sea. This is a shot you could hang on the lounge wall.

Reading and Books Group

This month we discussed Bill Bryson's 'At Home' which was a book we kept for two months to read over the Christmas period and beyond. It was full of historic facts about houses and the people that lived in them from the time of his own home in Norfolk in the 19th Century. He moved from room to room in his own house discussing the historical facts surrounding the use of that room. We were able to dip in and out of the book which, as is usual for Bill Bryson, is well written and researched.

However it was very thick and not always, we felt, pertinent to the story of his house. If however you want historical bits of information about the domestic life in the 19th century, this is the book for you.

The book for February was 'Where or When' by Anita Shreeve, a prolific storyteller from the USA.

It was not particularly liked by the group in spite of her overall popularity. The story of infidelity, betrayal, financial hardship and its effects being rather bland and predictable.

It told the tale of a Rhode Island estate agent who finds himself in financial trouble. Although faithfully married for many years he makes contact with a teenage girlfriend and they begin an affair. Powerfully drawn together once again these two characters are forced to come to terms with the nature of erotic love, betrayal and moral quandaries in an age of shifting values. The moral of the story was that deception and betrayal can lead to damage that, for all those involved, can be catastrophic. A sad and at times pathetic story, with a dramatic twist leading to the death of two of the story's characters and a life of guilt and sadness for those left behind.

We are all looking forward to our trips (3 in all for some of us) to this year's Essex Book Festival events.

Here we will meet and listen to Rachel Joyce who will be talking about her new book 'The Unlikely Pilgrimage of Harold Fry' at Brentwood Library, Martin Newell a poet, raconteur, and aging former rock god, who will be in Heybridge and Aline Templeton who following in the footsteps of Dorothy L. Sayers will be talking about her book 'Five Red Herrings And a Flock of Hens' at Witham Library.
