Family History

The next child born to the family about that time was John Baden Powell Brown (not many of them around) in 1900. A quick check found a death of an Arthur Brown also 1900; the following death certificate proved he was 'our' Arthur.

Cause of death was bronchial pneumonia at 14 months old, and the informant was an Alice Singleton a name unconnected to the family. More research discovered Alice in the 1901 census, and her occupation was 'midwife' bingo!

Alice must have registered the birth of John, and the death of Arthur at the same time, not, I would have thought, a confinement she would want to repeat.

What a sad story.
