Threads and Fabrics

This, along with an item on Woman's Hour, inspired me to look on the V&A museum's website, where they are featuring their new exhibition on Quilts. I can recommend it to all members who are interested in social history. The "Quilt" website has a series of photographs which can be enlarged by clicking on them, alongside a short description of their history. The three which took my eye were; Anne West's 1820 guilt which is more like a picture; the saddest one, the Rajah Quilt, sewn by the women deported and on her way to Australia and lastly a political one by Grayson Perry, The Right to Life Quilt which certainly makes a Statement. Scrolling through made me realise how much forward planning and design work goes into the making of what some call simple bedcovers. I wonder if, in future years, some

of our members beautiful quilts will end up on show at an exhibition as examples from the 21st century.
