William Tyler whose career, I understand, included both the Law and Education gave us an inspiring and often amusing talk entitled "Churchill - A study in Leadership". Much has been written on Churchill, arguably the greatest Prime Minister of the past century and William had made a detailed study of the great man. He had managed to understand why this unique man was exactly what our nation needed at the outbreak of the Second World War. It is hard to imagine that a man who had rebelled against the Establishment for most of his life was able to take decisive control of the country when it was on the very brink of invasion, even though he was already past "pensionable" age. Churchill was considered the only man of the hour and enjoyed popular support. It was ironic that when the war was over he lost the next election and the country decided to try socialism for the peacetime rebuilding. William's talk was thought provoking regarding the consequences of our defeat and it was also full of anecdotes with amusing guotes from Churchill's personal letters. William delivered his talk with total enthusiasm. We were privileged to hear him at one of our meetings.

There are some members who have not renewed their membership and subscriptions are overdue. I know that our groups have arranged some very well attended visits during the past month.
