## From the Speaker Secretary

Martyn Garwood was our speaker for our April Main Meeting. Martyn's career was as a Police Dog Handler and he told us about the training that for example an explosives search dog would have and how a dog's olfactory glands are so much better than ours at detecting scents. We heard about some of the scenarios faced by both handler and dog where the dog certainly seemed to come out as the superior being. Eventually Martyn retired and having decided not to have another dog when his black lab died, he found himself talking to someone training a 'Guide Dog' puppy and soon enough the family found themselves with a puppy. The 'trainee' stays with the family for about a year and then goes on to be assessed and have further training before being paired with an applicant. The reward is in hearing how the dog eventually can change a person's life, giving them fantastic support and new-found confidence. All this comes at a price however and it costs £57,000 to train and care for a Guide Dog throughout its life.
