### Visit to the Maldon Museum.

Thirteen Members of the Local History Group assembled in the warm sunshine in the Promenade Park, chatting quietly as they waited for 2.00 pm and the arrival of Paddy and Pam Lacey with the keys to the Museum. We were not disappointed - Paddy and Pam entertained and informed us with facts and anecdotes as they lovingly showed us the exhibits within. The delightful building was originally the Park Keepers house, but it had also been used as

apartments before its present use as a museum. The small rooms were able to be given themes and were full of every-day items from Victorian times through the war years and up to the recent past. Even though the museum is small, it is packed full of fascinating objects (all given by the people of Maldon) which are expertly displayed in settings showing how they were used. The major employers (now passed – Sadd's and Bentall's) had examples of their products and pictures of how their factories looked, together with some of the tools of their trade. Shops, hospitals, schools and homes, together with a splendid scale model of the impressive Maldon East station were also to be enjoyed.

This little gem is another source of information for those of us who are interested in studying the history of our town.
