There's a café in the museum for lunch or you can picnic in the park or visit a nearby pub or café.

After lunch we visit the Cutty Sark where lifts take you between decks and you can also go below the ship to fully appreciate the magnificent shape of the world's last clipper.

Next a short coach transfer ready for the final treat of the day - a return 360° flight on the new Emirates Air Line Thames Cable Car from The O2 to the Royal Docks and back again without getting off. It's gentle gliding in glass gondolas that seat up to 10 people and it really is great fun. There will be time to buy refreshments before heading home at 17.00.
