The presentation for the month of July, was entitled 'Word Processing' and was an introduction to the various forms of writing programs/applications available on the PC's, Laptops, Tablets, ipads etc'. The subject matter commenced with the question, "What is Word Processing?" We covered the concept of the operating system, the program source for the different forms of computers, some being common to the various Operating Systems. The saved output format was discussed, including where to find it. The 'open' format is the one which is used for transfer between the various suppliers of Word Processing programs. We also touched on the subject of input devices including keyboard, mouse, touchpad and touchscreen and which devices were used with the different pieces of computer equipment.

The main subject for the August Meeting will be an introduction to the 'Formatting of Documents' using the WORD program. Reference will be made to the similarities to other communication equipment will also be covered. We will also cover 'Labels' and if time permits, the important subject of filing and saving of documents.. Members of the Computer Group have requested that we cover subjects such as 'Simple ways of sorting out Photographs'. We try and cover subjects that you wish to be more familiar with and knowledgeable about, building up from your current level of knowledge.

The subscription, to pay for the room hire, has stayed at £7 for the third quarter of 2015 and may reduce to £5 if no December Meeting takes place. French Conversation Group

In July tennis, in particular Wimbledon, was on the minds of most of our members. Jenny had found an article from the Huffington Post (in French) for us to read. It explained the history of the game, with an explanation of how the scoring system came into being. The article went back to the 12th century when, in the monastery cloisters in North West France, a game was played where the monks used the open palms of their hands to knock a ball back towards their opponents. According to the article, they had a service line each on which to stand (120 steps apart) and a central line or rope over which they had to hit the ball. When a player scored, he was allowed to go 15 steps towards the rope (15, 30, 45 or 60 steps away from the service line). This, without the movement of position, is similar to the modern game. Later the game developed into 'real tennis' which was a much faster game, with racquets. Forty-five, in French quarante – cinq, took too long to say and was replaced by 40. The article also explained how the expression 'deuce' came into being. When the players attained 40-40 the arbiter/umpire called 'a deux' which in translation from early French became transmuted into deuce. But where did 'love' come from? A zero point looked on the scoreboard like the shape of an egg (l'oeuf in French). This in an English accent came out as 'love'.

This inspired me to further research. I found a website for 'real tennis first start' (in English) which gave me the information that the balls were first made from worn out monks robes and that a modern version still exists under the name courte-paume. Wikipedia also delivered a photo of a page from a 'Book of Hours', of

monks enjoying themselves. The name tennis is thought to be derived from the word 'tenez' which in those times meant 'take heed'.

If I have inspired your interest in the history of tennis many more sites can also be found.
