Our speaker at the July meeting was Roger Smith. Roger was the speaker at our first meeting and was also the first Chairman of the Blackwater U3A. As one of those forward thinking U3A members, he was also involved in getting our U3A started three and a half years ago (somehow, it seems longer than that!). Roger is one of those people for whom volunteering is a way of life. He is the curator of the Stow Maries Aerodrome and works out of the fine museum which he, and a few others dressed in overalls and builders boots, rescued from decay. Roger's deep involvement in the World War 1 aerodrome was aroused when he discovered that the owner had bought it with the vision of restoring it to

it's original state whilst, at the same time, making the surrounding area a nature reserve. One of the first projects completed was the new War Memorial dedicated to those members of the 37 Squadron RFC (later the RAF) who were stationed at Stow Maries during WW1. The memorial was constructed on the site of the original parade ground. Roger explained that he has a particular association with the aerodrome because, during WW1, his Great Grandfather was stationed with 37 Squadron at Stow Maries.

With so much ahead to do, and maybe with a little help from the U3A, we wish this important project every success.

I look forward to being with you all again at our next meeting on Friday 14<sup>th</sup> September, when Chris Thornton will talk to us about some more aspects of our diverse Local History.
