#### Local History Group

We had an afternoon feeling a bit like we were on the film set for the Harrison Ford film "Raiders of the Lost Ark", or maybe something suitable for a murder scene for an episode "Midsommer Murders". Yes, our imaginations were a bit wild but the brickworks at Marks Tey certainly fuelled this with its out-of- this-time set up of clay mills, sand heaps, trollies on rails etc. The company was begun in 1863 and although some things are done mechanically the majority of the individual bricks are hand-formed in the way they always have been, mostly of clay from the on-site clay pits. The very small workforce, two in the office and three in the works, manage to produce enough bricks to fill the kiln for firing about every three weeks, that's about 18,000 bricks. Each maker produces approximately 2,750 bricks per week. The average three-bedroom house takes about 13,500 bricks. Wooden moulds are constructed to individual requirements and they have a great store of these so that bricks may then be replicated. [We saw some marked for Eton College].

# **Obituary: Beryl Claydon**

hose of you who remember Beryl will be saddened to learn that she died last week. Beryl was a member of our U3A from its inception in 2009. A former school teacher,

she served on the Heybridge Parish Council and, in recognition of her services, the Claydon Room in the Plantation Hall was named after her.

Beryl was also a keen local historian and in August 2012 she launched her book on the history of Heybridge in the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> centuries. Peter Thorpe, Chairman at the time, wrote in the News Sheet:



Many of us have been aware that Beryl was writing a book but few, if any, were aware of the scope and level of detail involved in her research. It is easy to read, as it is written in a style which emphasises the facts in an anecdotal way, as if the topic is being talked about by the people involved at the time. At nearly 300 pages, this is an impressive book and I am sure that it will be an important source of information for those interested in the local history of our piece of Essex for many years to come.
