A Marsh Harrier or Buzzard was soaring in the distance. Unfortunately it did not come near enough for us to be sure.

The best part of the day for us was two birds that we had not seen before as a group. They were a Meadow Pipit and a Wheatear. If Tim had not been with us I don't think we would have been able to say for sure what we had seen.

Reading and Books Group

This month's book gave rise to differing levels of enjoyment. 'The Taste of Sorrow' by Jude Morgan is a well written, but unusual book in that it seemed to take the form of a novel, but the author used the lives, and times of the Bronte family as the substance of the story.

She provided a shocking insight into the treatment of girls, in particular, from a middle class educated background but living in the mid 19th century without the benefit of a middle class level of income. We were able to see how the harshness of their lives and the times in which they lived, was alleviated for the children by a rich fantasy life which, in turn, gave rise to the stories so many of us have enjoyed, both in the past and today.

Some of us found the story somewhat harrowing as the family coped, with what we would regard now as neglect and mistreatment of children, compounded by the sadness of the untimely deaths of the mother, sisters and brother. The loyalty and love that the family had for each other was heartening, but viewed as it has been by us, from the 21st century, some of us found it a sad and difficult narrative.

However, this story did give rise to much interesting discussion about the roles played by men and women in the present day, as opposed to that of the mid 19th century. The consensus of the group being that family life today is greatly enhanced, in our opinion, particularly by the much more loving and involved role fathers play in family life.

We have decided to live it up a little in December, by celebrating Christmas together and enjoy ourselves at a local restaurant.
