Tank fermentation is cheaper as it's less labour-intensive, the bubbles are more frothy and spritzy and the sweet fruity taste is retained. Champagne requires a more elaborate process with attention to every bottle, resulting in a greater depth, finer bubbles and a biscuity flavour making it more expensive to produce.



BLETCHLEY PARK – Home of the Codebreakers

N either a slow-moving M25 nor a damp and drizzly day could dampen our enthusiasm for a day at Bletchley Park!



This manor house in Buckinghamshire was Britain's main decryption establishment during World War Two. Cyphers and codes of several Axis countries were decrypted including, most importantly, those generated by the German Enigma and Lorenz machines.

The official historian of World War II British Intelligence has written that the intelligence produced at Bletchley shortened the war by two to four years, and that without it the outcome of the war would have been uncertain.

In 2014, the Bletchley Park Trust began work on the long-awaited £8-million Heritage Lottery Funded restoration programme. This project has seen the resurrection of the derelict wartime code-breaking huts as well as the return of the garden and grounds to their 1940's appearance, enabling visitors to step back in time to the scenery the Codebreakers would have seen.

Work on restoring Bletchley Park is ongoing so a future trip will be well worth while! Thanks to Pat for organising such an interesting day and to our friends from Blackwater U3A for joining us.
