NEWS FROM THE COMMITTEE

From the Chairman

ast month I explained to the people at our meeting that we intend making some changes to the way we provide refreshments and why. I am repeating that information for the benefit of those who missed the meeting. (You missed an interesting talk and a baffling demonstration of magic.)

The issue concerns the Gift Aid we claim in respect of membership subscriptions. To qualify for Gift Aid, subscriptions must be for membership only, i.e. access to the educational activities which form part of our objectives. Under the benefit rule, they should not provide the individual with any other benefit. At the U3A Conference I attended recently, it was suggested that HMRC may consider the provision of free tea and coffee at monthly meetings as a benefit, in which case, our Gift Aid claim might be rejected.

To avoid this scenario, we intend to introduce charges for refreshments at the monthly meeting. While we need to cover costs, we will aim to keep the cost as low as possible at 20p for tea /coffee and a biscuit. There will be an honesty box on the counter next to the drinks for your payments and this will start at the November meeting. We also intend to reduce the subscription slightly next year so that most of you should not be out of pocket. This change will need your approval at the AGM and, if approved, will come into effect on 1st April 2017, which is the start of the new membership year.

The Committee is delighted that Colin Mason is prepared to be our Technical Adviser and we look forward to welcoming him at our meetings.

Our latest book was written by the 2011 Mann-Booker prize winner Julian Barnes.

The Sense of an Ending takes the main male character through adolescence to retirement.

The author navigates, with great skill, the character, feelings and behaviour of a sex-hungry, book-hungry girless sixth former. It also described, with great clarity, the wit, affection and affectations of a group of sixth form boys who all swear to stay friends for life, moving through to his characters' career, a single marriage, a calm divorce and ultimately retirement. We see how a youth full of expectation, moves through to disappointment, disillusion, and flawed memories of the past.

The characterisation we felt was poor and the storyline weak. Some felt it was intellectually pretentious. However it was a short story and contained much more than we were able to define in our short discussion. Insightful, beautifully written with great precision, it was more a story of the human condition and a life lived, than an exciting novel about larger than life characters.

One of the books contained words in the text that had been underlined and indeed this story would seem to be an excellent text for an A level student. All in all not the enjoyable escapism we seem to prefer.
