If there is more than one person nominated for any one position, a vote will take place at the AGM on Friday 8th March 2013.

The names of Nominees and positions will be published in the March issue of the News Sheet, which will be available prior to the AGM.

Bird Watching Group

It was a lovely dry morning as we met up with John, a volunteer at Abbotts Hall Farm. We had only gone a few yards when we heard a Song Thrush singing in the trees. Ahead, the track seemed full of Chaffinches. We watched them, there could have been more than fifty, darting from ground to bushes for ages.

The fields and bushes were also full of Fieldfare, (Fieldfare belong to the Thrush family) as we carried on down the track to the first hide. I have never seen so many in one place before.

From the wetland hide you can see the Salcott Channnel and the breaches made in the sea wall. This was done to encourage species of waders and wildlife. While we were in the hide we saw Little Egret, Curlew, Grey Plover, Lapwing, Brent Geese and Cormorant. As we made our way to the Lake Hide, John explained what a lot of work is involved keeping the salt water away from the lake. There is an island on the lake on which a Snipe never seemed to move, at least while we were watching. We also saw Shelduck and Wigeon.

As we started to make our way back, flocks of birds took flight and flying low, was a Marsh Harrier. What a wonderful way to end our day.

However, we all enjoyed 'Private Peaceful', our current novel written by Michael Morpurgo. It is set in the First World War and follows the lives of the Peaceful brothers from their rural background in the West Country to the battleground of the First World War.

The style is simple and the pace gentle. England is quiet and peaceful until the landowner of the estate threatens to eject the Peaceful family from their tied cottage unless Charlie joins up. Tommo decides to accompany him.

Following an injury, Charlie Peaceful is sent home to England to recover, but he does not tell his wife or his mother about the terrors of war; the mud, the rats and the lice, or the injuries and death of his fellow soldiers. Charlie returns to the fighting and when he is ordered to attack, he refuses to leave his brother, Tommo, who is injured. Charlie is arrested for cowardice and he gives Tommo a watch he had received from an injured captain, for saving his life. The story is heart rending as Tommo tracks the time until his brother is executed and each chapter begins with the passing of the minutes and hours through one night. The book, originally written for young people, is an unflinching introduction to the historical background of the First World War. The relationships between family, friends and authority are sensitively written.
