We had a great time at Old Hall Marshes. It was chilly but dry.

I had asked Derek, a local bird watcher to join us as he knew the area.

We walked to where there were lots of waders and ducks for us to see. The waders were the Redshank, Lapwing, Oystercatcher, Curlew and large groups of Golden Plover. Derek told us how to know how we could tell if they were Golden or Grey plover but only when flying. It seems that the Grey have hairy armpits, I think we will remember that, we have just got to get them to fly!!

Some of our favourite Ducks were also there, Shelduck, Pintail, Teal and Tufted.

As we walked along, flocks of Geese flew over us and some settled on the marshes, a mixture of Canada, Greylag and Brent. Noisy lot! In the reeds we heard Meadow pipits and Reed bunting.

The RSBP have put up nesting boxes for the Marsh Harrier and this year have had four breeding pairs, we were able to watch two flying along the hedges hunting for lunch. It's always a pleasure to watch these large birds of Prey.

The latest available census was taken in 1911, the 1921 census will not be released until 2021, the 1931 census was destroyed by fire and the 1941 census was not taken due to the war so the 1939 Register fills in a large gap in the family historian's story.

French Conversation Group

As our November meeting spanned the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, we read an article in which the French Secretary of State for Women's Rights described the forgotten role that women played to keep the economy afloat during the 1914-18 war. Over a million women worked in agriculture, 100,000 were nurses and millions more kept the factories going. Yet at the end of the war, they were offered one month's salary to give up their jobs to men returning from the front. This despite the fact that 3 million had become war widows and many others had no news of their loved one. Moreover, although their contribution was deemed invaluable to the war effort, it was not until 1945 that French women received the right to vote.

Continuing with the theme of women in war, we then read an article entitled 'La Miss de la Légion étrangère'. It described the exploits of Susan Travers, who was born in England in 1909 but moved to France as a child. During WW2 she worked variously as a nurse and ambulance driver, before joining de Gaulle's Free French forces as a chauffeur. Posted to Africa, her sang froid and courage earned her the respect of the officers with whom she worked, who called her 'La Miss'. Later, she became the personal driver of the Colonel in charge of a small French fort in the Libyan Desert and during the battle of Bir Hakeim she cared for the dying and the wounded, witnessing some terrible scenes. When lack of food and munitions forced the Colonel to withdraw, it was Susan who led the convoy of some 2,500 men through enemy fire to re-join the allied forces. Once the war was over, she became the first woman to be admitted to la Légion étrangère and, eleven years after the war ended, she was awarded the Croix de Guerre 1939-45 for her bravery during the battle of Bir Hakeim.
